"How foolish can you be? After starting your new lives in the Spirit, why are you now trying to become perfect by your own human effort?" – Galatians 3:3 (NLT)

"And all of us, as with unveiled face, [because we] continued to behold [in the Word of God] as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are constantly being transfigured into His very own image in ever increasing splendor and from one degree of glory to another; [for this comes] from the Lord [Who is] the Spirit." – 2 Corinthians 3:18 (AMPC)

"He Who began a good work in you will continue until the day of Jesus Christ [right up to the time of His return], developing [that good work] and perfecting and bringing it to full completion in you." – Philippians 1:6 (AMPC)

Under this Covenant of Grace, God does not want us focused on our sins or the bad things we do, He wants us focused on what Jesus Christ has done; the good things that we were given credit for, at the Cross.

As we shift the focus away from our short-comings, to the Grace and Truth of Jesus, we realize that condemnation and guilt cannot live in, or occupy the space that the Truth of Jesus occupies. Then, we stop working so hard to not do bad things, and stop working so hard to do good things.

Instead, we are like a tree. A tree does not struggle to bear fruit, it does not strain and labor. It just happens naturally, because it is a tree. In the same way, when we accept and grow in our new identity in Jesus, and focus on Him instead of us, we will begin to bear good fruit (good deeds) without much effort. Now, if when a tree begins to grow new leaves, it happens to still have some dead leaves from a former season, the tree does not labor to cut off the old leaves. Instead, the sap, or life-blood, which flows to the branches, takes up the space where the dead leaves are, and the dead leaves just drop off.

Here are some additional Scriptures that support this topic:

"He refreshes and restores my life (my self). He leads me in the paths of righteousness [uprightness and right standing with Him—not for my earning it, but] for His name's sake." – Psalm 23:3 (AMPC)

"I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, my soul shall be joyful in my God; for He has clothed me with the garments of salvation, He has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with ornaments, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels." – Isaiah 61:10 (NKJV)
